Nigeria: Habila Shot for Refusing to Deny Jesus

The pounding on the door was followed by the sound of men yelling for Habila to come out with his family. Habila rushed to get dressed. When he entered the front room with his wife, Vivian, and their young son close behind, he faced intruders wearing robes and masks. One was armed with an AK-47. Habila said a short prayer to the Lord.

After announcing that they were there to do the work of Allah, the men began to question Habila. They asked him his name, his profession, whether he was a policeman or in the military, and whether he was a Christian or Muslim.

"I am a Christian," he replied.

Vivian was terrified, knowing the men were members of Boko Haram.

The intruders told Habila that they were giving him the opportunity to live—and live a better life—if he would only become a Muslim and say the shahada [Islamic profession of faith that includes, "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is his messenger"]. They even asked him to join them as a member of Boko Haram.

All the while, Habila was prepared to die. "I am a Christian and will always remain a Christian," he replied, "even to death." (The website has the full interview with Habila.)

Lines from the LIBRARY

"Iranian Christian," by Nasser Lofti, the new book in the library, relates the incredible experiences of a former Moslem and explains why the Islamic world is so hostile to the Christian West.

The author says the Koran contains 114 sutras, or chapters, and was revealed only to Mohammed, Al-

lah's prophet. He verbally related the revelations to his followers who wrote down what he said on stone, leather, and other materi-

als. The scattered written fragments of the Koran were first collected by Mohammed's immediate successor, Abu Bakr, shortly after the prophet's death. More than 40 inspired writers were involved in recording God's word in the 66 books of the Bible, with its 1189 chapters. Although the writers of the New Testament did not put it in writing until about 40 to 60 years after Jesus' death, their accounts came directly from eyewitness accounts of Jesus' life on the earth. Their accounts differ somewhat, but the most important truths do not vary at all. Obviously, the new Testament can easily withstand the test of historical authenticity.

The Moslem religion is sadly lacking in the gentle comfort of love which permeates the hearts of Christians. Fear, not love, seems to be the motivating force in Islam. Allah is never projected as a loving Father and fear of Allah's wrath overcomes any ideas of love. The Bible, like the Koran, teaches submission to the will of God. But it teaches submission through understanding love rather than through fear. Christians are instructed to do good to all men and to serve God out of love for Him and for His Son.

As early as possible, children are taught to testify to the deity of the one God, Allah, and to Mohammed, the prophet of Allah. These little ones are taught to hate and despise any and all other religious sects in the world while great pride for their own belief is instilled in their minds. At age five, children enter religious schools and are taught to write the 99 names of God and other words from the Koran. As they learn to read and write, they commit much of the Koran to memory. The Koran clearly states in several places that Moslems should not become friends with Christians and Jews (Sura 5:51;60:13). Those who do befriend Jews and Christians incur the wrath of Allah and will endure eternal torment (Sura 5:81).

The most important element of the Moslem view of Christianity is that the Bible lacks authenticity. The Koran is the only book of authentic revealed scripture. The Christian knows that the New Testament was not written before Jesus' death because people followed the oral tradition of teaching during that time period. It was only after the message began to spread to other countries that three men, Matthew, Mark, and Luke, decided to write down the eyewitness accounts of Christ's life. (and much more)

It is unfortunate that Moslems have been so intent on denying Christian belief concerning Jesus Christ they have overlooked much written, historical evidence of Jesus' crucifixion and subsequent resurrection.
